<p>Transport A method of moving from one place to another.</p>	<p>Railway A track made of steel that a train travels on.</p>
<p>Vehicle Something that is used to transport people or items.</p>	<p>Train A number of carriages connected to a locomotive.</p>
<p>Engineer A person who designs, builds or looks after engines, machines or structures.</p>	<p>Locomotive The engine that pulls carriages on a train.</p>
<p>Isambard Kingdom Brunel An engineer who built the Great Western Railway and the Clifton Suspension Bridge.</p>	<p>Carriage A type of vehicle that is pulled by a locomotive.</p>
<p>Steam train A train that is powered from steam which is produced from a coal fire in the locomotive.</p>	<p>Electric train A train that is powered by electric.</p>
<p>Past Something that has already happened.</p>	<p>Present Something that is happening now.</p>
<p>Evidence Something that proves something existed or is true.</p>	<p>Change The process through which something becomes different.</p>
<p>Decade A period of ten years.</p>	<p>Significant Something really important.</p>
