Can you create a poster about how to stay safe at a train station and how to stay safe on a train?	3. Choose a type of transport. Can you research how the transport has changed over time? You may choose how to record your findings.	4. Can you make our teddy an umbrella out of waterproof materials?
5. How many different types of transport can you name? You may like to draw pictures of them or write a list.	6. Can you write some sentences to compare the heights of the people in your family? Try to use the words taller than and shorter than.	7. Can you make a poster to show the days of the week and the months of the year? How quickly can you say them in the correct order?	8. How many different types of materials can you list?
9. With a grown up, can you use the internet to find out information about trains?	10. Can you draw a picture of an object? Now look at the detail on that object. Can you have another go? How can you make your drawing better?	11. Can you draw some straight lines using a ruler? Compare the lengths of them using the words longer than and shorter than.	12. Make your own repeating pattern. Now use a camera to take a photograph of your pattern. Can you also draw your pattern?
13. Write a story about a vehicle. Remember to use capital letters and full stops.	14. Can you practise telling and writing the times on a clock to the hour and half past the hour?	15. Can you design a poster telling someone how to be a good friend?	16. Can you label a picture of a train? You may want to use a photograph or draw your own.
